During the 2005-06 school year under the guidance of Lion Steckler, the Chapel Hill Lions Club screened 1178 kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> graders resulting in 357 needing glasses.

During the 2006-07 school year screening of kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grades, 2927 students were screened with 942 needing glasses.

The school nurses even told them that their screening procedures are far more accurate and reliable than what they could do.

## SPRING CABINET MEETING

District 25-F

Aurora Elementary School

March 4, 2007

District Governor Carlos Dieckmann called the meeting to order.

Vice District Governor PDG Bob Price led us in the Pledge to the Flag.

PDG Denny Shaul led us in one verse of "America"

PDG Bud Lowery gave the invocation.

District Governor Carlos then informed us that the first item on the agenda would be to vote. The Cabinet Secretary along with "helpers" passed out the ballots to all those certified to vote. Since there were some attendees that had stated that they had not been given a chance to get certified, PDG Bob Booher gave them an additional 3 minutes to get certified to vote. After everyone had been given ample time to vote, PCC Bob Booher and PDG Jack Salsbery collected the ballots to be counted.

PDG Bud Lowery then stated according to the Constitution and By-law's that at the Spring Cabinet Meeting we are to elect the Region Trustees for Camp Woodsmoke. At that time he only had one opening for Region 7 Camp Woodsmoke Trustee. He then ask if there was a nomination for a Region Chairperson. PDG Jack Salsbery then nominated Lion Jerry Smith from Milan Lions Club, nomination was 2<sup>nd</sup> by PDG Bob Price. Motion passed.

PDG Bud then introduced our candidate for the International Convention Committee PDG Peg Dawson from Speedway.

District Governor Carlos then introduced the following: International Director Lion L. Doug Sime and his wife Lion Vale; Council Chair Lion Linda Tincher and her husband PDG Vern; Vice District Governor PDG Bob Price and his wife Lion Pat; Past International Director Lion Carter Everage; Past District Governor Lion Doug Lozier and his wife Kathy from District "D"; Past Council Chairs Lion Tom Flack and Lion Bob Booher and all Past District Governors.

We then went straight into the reports.

Lion Terri Stauffer from the Indianapolis Downtown Club gave a report on the State Convention. She gave us a run down on some of the highlights for the convention, including a golf outing on Friday, with a new car for a "hole in one" prize, a reception on Friday night at the Indiana State Museum, exhibit hall, High Tea on Saturday, the Governors champagne reception on Saturday night, Memorial Service on Sunday morning, the W.P. Woods and Melvin Jones brunch on Sunday morning and of course the hospitality rooms.

PDG Tom Slattery then came forward to speak on behalf of PDG Vern Tincher who is a candidate for the International Convention Committee. PDG Vern then came to the podium to ask us for our support in his bid for this committee.

PID Carter Everage was then called to come forward to speak on behalf of PDG Peg Dawson, District 25-F's own candidate for the International Convention Committee. PDG Peg then also asked us for our support at the State Convention.

PDG Tom Slattery "Thanked" everyone for the cards, prayers, phone calls and genuine concern for his wife during her illness. He then gave us a report on the recent Mexico Mission Trip. During this trip they were able to provide 9,329 people with glasses. He also touched on Retention and how we can keep the members we have.

DG Carlos then reinforced what PDG Tom Slattery had to say about Retention by passing on to us what the International President Lion Jimmy Ross has to say on the subject. Like having a reason in the club for the new member to come to meetings and a purpose for them so they feel needed and welcomed. If you do this they will feel like they made the right decision to join.

DG Carlos then called on Lion Don Greer for Camp Woodsmoke to come forward and give us the latest update on the pipeline that is to go through the camp. He told us that the company has agreed to move the proposed pipeline to an area that the campers never use on the back 24 acres of the property. NOTHING is final and he will keep us posted on any new developments as he received them. He will make no decisions without the approval of the board.

Lion Dottie Flack was next on the agenda with a report on Cancer Control. She reported that on just 2 of the treatment machines in the Department of Radiology Oncology there were over 56,000 times last year those machines administered treatments. She then told us a story about a phone call she received the week before from a Lion in a different corner of the state. His doctor had told him that he had a tumor growing on a nerve that allows him to hear. The doctor also wanted him to go to the Cleveland Clinic for

his Gamma Knife treatment. Being a Lion he was aware of the Gamma Knife at IU and was questioning why couldn't he have his treatments in Indianapolis. The Cleveland Clinic said it would be 2 ½ months before they could get him in for his treatments. Lion Dottie went to work, this was on Thursday morning, and by Thursday afternoon, that Lion had an appointment for the following Monday morning with his treatment being done on Tuesday morning. Isn't it GREAT to be a Lion! To know that because of you this was able to happen.

PDG Jack Salsbery gave a report on the Vision Van program. He reported that since 10/15/2006 we have performed 8,707 vision screenings in District 25-F alone. That does not include the 9,000 + screenings just performed in Mexico. He is going to ask the Vision Van Board at their meeting later that afternoon to let him purchase some extra equipment. He also reminded us to send our screening reports to Lion Denise Salsbery who is keeping a database for us.

Council Chair Lion Linda Tincher spoke to us about the International Convention in Chicago on July 1-7, 2007. She was wearing the official parade uniform for us to see and purchase if we wanted.

PDG Fran Shaul, Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired representative encouraged us to attend the State Convention and support the ISBVI to make them a State Project. She also told us of a "work day" on March 24, 2007 at the school to help them get some painting done.

PDG Bob Price gave a report on Youth Exchange. We had 2 girls and 1 boy this time. As always PDG Bob is in need of host families. He has several kids wanting to come but he needs families. He also reminded us of the \$2000.00 scholarships that are available. After his Youth Exchange report PDG Bob Price passed out "Certificates of Appreciation" to PDG Tom Slattery and Lion Julia Robbins to behalf of the Mexico Missions group.

The next 2 people on the agenda were not present so DG Carlos filled us in. The Morgantown Lions Club in District E-1 will be celebrating their 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary on March 24, 2007 and wanted to extend an invitation to our District to attend.

The other person, Coach Mike Walker, wanted to speak to us about the East-West all-stars Game.

DG Carlos reminded us all about "Charter Night" for our newest club South Henry to be held Saturday, March 17, 2007.

Lion Mike Crull then came forward to give a report for the Eye & Tissue Bank. The Indiana Eye & Tissue Bank will be celebrating their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary in the year 2009. The Eye Bank is doing well; they now have ownership of their new property. There is remodeling to be done to the new building. If anyone knows of a Lion member that would be interested in doing the work please contact one of the Trustees.

Lion Pauline Ullery and Storm came before the assembly to talk about Leader Dogs. She told us there has been several staff changes at the Leader Dog facilities. Lion Pauline and Storm are available to come to your club to give a program on Leader Dog. The construction on the new

kennels is almost finished. The buildings are in the process of being remodeled.

Because of health reasons, Lion Joyce Back, Speech & Hearing Trustee resigned her position effective immediately. This was originally announced at the Winter Cabinet Meeting in Speedway. DG Carlos introduced her replacement, Lion Patti Sharp.

PDG Carl Sharp, Jr. gave a Campaign SightFirst II report. At the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter mark, as of February 28, 2007, LCIF awards donations from our District alone total \$23,446.52. We can be proud of the fact that so far the donations we have raised will save the eyesight of approximately 4,000 people.

DG Carlos then asked if anyone else had a report that they wanted to give. Since no one came forward, ID Doug Sime came forward to speak to us for a few minutes. He spoke about the projects he had visited the day before and how impressed he was.

Lion Gene Wagoner gave a report for the Foundation. You no longer have to see a Trustee to get a license plate application. The BMV will charge you \$25.00 with \$20.00 going to the Foundation.

PDG Vern Tincher State Law Camp Chair informed us of the dates for Law Camp. The Law Camp in Anderson will be June 6-9; the Indiana State Police Law Camp at Vincennes University will be June 27-30. The fee will be \$110.00. The applications are on the State website.

DG Carlos asked one more time if anyone else wanted to speak to the assembly. Since we had a little extra time the Governor (on behalf of himself and Lion Norma) "Thanked" District F and the clubs for all they have done to make the last year a success. He encouraged everyone to attend the State Convention.

Cabinet Secretary Lion Malynda Clevenger informed the assembly that as of February 28, 2007 the District stands at a minus 1 in membership. We have the best total in the State at this time. We are also in the number 1 spot on membership with a total of 2,161.

DG Carlos then adjourned the meeting.

After lunch DG Carlos called the meeting to order.

DG Carlos began the afternoon session by calling on the Cabinet Secretary to give the results of the morning election. The results were as follows: District Governor-Elect-VDG/PDG Bob Price, Pike; Vice District Governor Elect-Lion Merle Goldman, Indy Washington Twp.; Speech & Hearing Trustee-Lion R. Wayne Reynolds, Speedway; Leader Dog Trustee-Lion R.N. Chambers, Speedway; Eye & Tissue Bank Trustee-Lion Michael Pence, Beech Grove; Indiana Lions Foundation-PCC Bob Booher, Speedway; Cancer Control Trustee-Lion Paul Shane, Columbus.

The Cabinet Secretary then officially introduced our guest speaker for the day, International Director Lion L. Doug Sime. ID Doug Sime then gave us a very interesting talk about his travels and the things he has seen. Not only in our District but also in other areas he has been to. Anyone who missed out on this talk missed out on a Great program. ID Doug then presented his "friendship banners" to: DG Carlos and Lion Norma; VDG/PDG Bob Price and Lion Pat; CS Lion Malynda Clevenger; Lion Dottie Flack; the Speech & Hearing project; Aurora Lions Club.

DG Carlos along with the help of ID Doug presented International President's Certificates of Appreciation to: PDG Jack Salsbery and PDG Tom Slattery.

## Lions' service a boon to Fountain City

Jim Fisher and Bonnie Roark could pull up a chair, kick up their feet and relax for the rest of their lives.

No one would begrudge them. They have a right to spend retirement as they see fit.

They're spending it in action. And others will be the beneficiaries of their efforts.

The Fountain City Lions Club members are mounting a mission to bring more senior housing to the small town north of Richmond.

A 12-unit complex west of Front Street, between Hartley and Fountain streets, is expected to break ground in May. The complex will consist of eight one-bedroom units and four two-bedroom units.

If built, its tenants will be low-income seniors (62 or older) who make 40 percent, 50 percent and 60 percent of the area median income.

A savvy grant writer helped them secure the last of three grants needed to fund the \$1.1 million outreach project.

The pair still has a lot of tough work to finish from annexing the land, to rezoning it, to finding eligible tenants to occupy the future property.

Fisher describes the process as challenging.

We describe their actions as impressive.

And the project has backing from at least one important entity: the Wayne County Foundation.

"It's a project that we can be supportive of because it benefits a segment of our population that has needs," said Steve Borchers, executive director, whose group gave the club an \$18,000 grant.

We applaud Fisher, Roark and their fellow Lions for seeing a need, attacking it with vigor and working hard to overcome the challenges.

"(This building) would just be a drop in the bucket -- it's only going to be 12 apartments," Roark said. "But you have to have someplace to start."
