Austin High School October 1, 2006

PCC Tom Flack then came forward and asked the membership for a motion for the following. To transfer \$15,000.00 from the money market account to the vision van and to transfer \$1,000.00 from eye glass & eye exam payable to the vision van. Lion Bill Hicks made the motion to transfer the \$15,000.00, PDG Jack Buckland 2nd. MOTION PASSED

The Governor then received donations from the following clubs: Franklin & Lawrence.

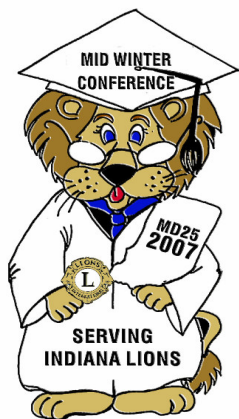
